### Pastor's Pen

### Hello Church!

When we think back to Christmas as children, most of us can still feel that unmistakable sense of wonder. The tree seemed taller. The lights seemed brighter. The world felt bigger, more magical, and full of possibility. We didn't have to try to feel it—wonder simply found us.

As adults, that kind of wonder can feel harder to come by. We get busy. We get tired. We get used to things. But the story of Scripture—and the story of Christmas itself—invites us to remember that God has always worked in ways that stir awe and spark hope.

Think of Abraham. God promised him something that sounded impossible: that he would become the father of a great nation. Abraham was old, worn, past the age when dreams like that seem realistic. And yet, God called him to lift his eyes, believe the impossible, and step forward in trust. Abraham's story begins with wonder—a holy, surprising, joyful astonishment at what God can do when everything seems unlikely.

This December, I want to invite you to look for that same kind of wonder. Not childish wonder, but childlike wonder—the kind Jesus said we should never lose. Wonder opens our eyes to God's movement. Wonder reminds us that God is not done working. Wonder nudges us to trust when we don't yet see the whole picture.

Christmas is, at its core, a story of unexpected wonder: A young girl chosen to carry the Savior. Shepherds caught off guard by singing angels. Wise men following a strange star. A King arriving in a manger. Nobody saw it coming. But those who were willing to look, listen, and follow were swept into the joy of what God was doing.

May this Advent season awaken your heart again. Slow down. Look around. Ask God to help you see the beauty, the miracles, the quiet gifts, and the surprising moments He may already be placing in your path. Let wonder draw you closer to Him—and let faith rise as you trust that God is still leading, still speaking, and still doing the extraordinary in the middle of ordinary days.

This December, may we not only celebrate Christmas— may we rediscover the wonder of a God who still delights in surprising His people.




