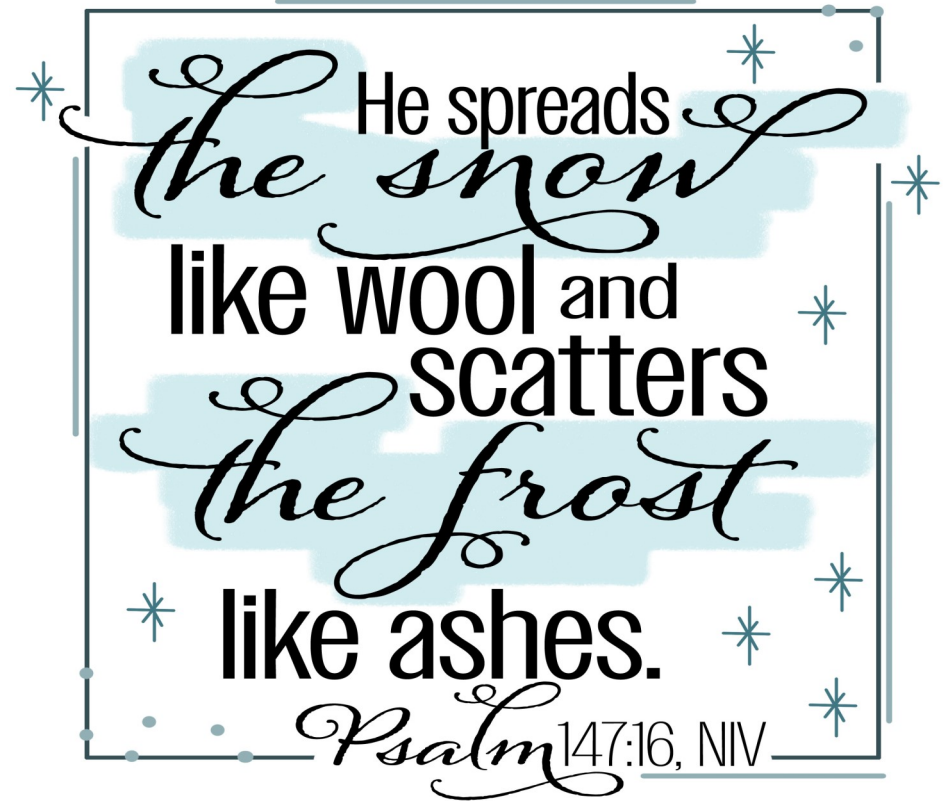

Hello Church!

January has a way of making us pause. The decorations are packed away, the calendar is clean, and we stand at the beginning of a new year—carrying both hope and heaviness with us. Some of us step into January excited and expectant. Others arrive tired, uncertain, or still carrying the weight of the year behind us.

That is why these words from Lamentations are such a gift.

This passage was written in the middle of grief, loss, and devastation. And yet, right there in the pain, the writer proclaims a powerful truth: God's faithful love never ends. His mercies never run out. No matter what yesterday held, God meets us today with mercy that is new.

January often tempts us to believe everything depends on our resolve—our discipline, our plans, our ability to "do better." But Scripture reminds us that the foundation of this new year is not our faithfulness to God, but God's faithfulness to us. Each morning we wake up, we are met not with judgment for yesterday, but with fresh mercy for today.

As we begin this year together as a church, let us lean into that promise. Let us start our days expecting God's mercy, trusting His love, and believing that He is at work—even in places that feel unfinished or uncertain. Whatever this year holds, we do not walk into it alone. We walk into it carried by a God whose faithfulness is great and whose mercy is new every single morning.

May this January be a time of renewed hope, quiet trust, and grateful hearts as we receive the mercies God so freely gives.

We continually give God thanks for the generosity of the Bethlehem Church family!



- Mini marshmallows or candy pearls

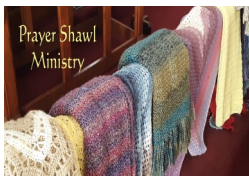


What you do:

(Psalm 139:14, KJV)

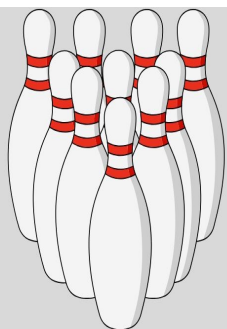

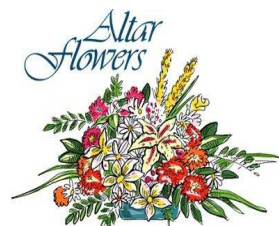
