

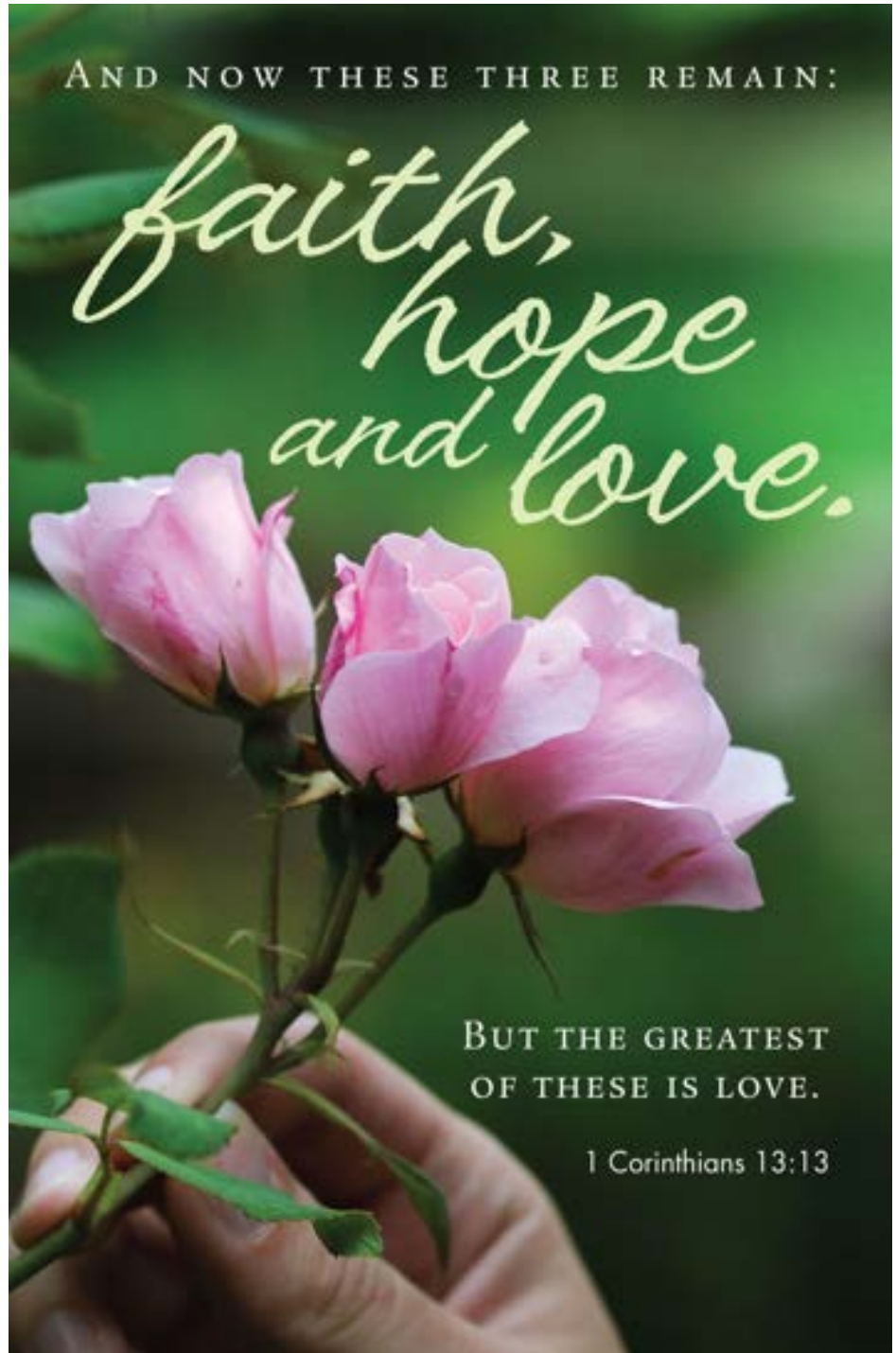

Hello Church,

We've been on an incredible, year-long journey through God's magnificent Word! I hope this experience has been meaningful for you and that you've been able to see how every part of Scripture ultimately points to salvation through Jesus Christ.

We began in Genesis, exploring our origins and God's first covenant with humanity. From there, we followed God's deliverance of His people, their entrance into the Promised Land, and the heartbreaking cycle of sin and repentance that followed. We witnessed the rise and fall of a kingdom, the exile into foreign lands, and the hopeful anticipation of the long-awaited Savior.

Visiting Peggy Fravel at the Trolley Road campus of Country Meadows finds this busy woman taking advantage of every opportunity. Peggy has many friends from all the congregations she and her late husband Rev. Dr. Ray Fravel served as a United Methodist minister in Pennsylvania, including Yorkshire and Bethlehem in later years. They met as high school juniors when Ray moved to live with his grandparents in Niagara Falls, NY and became sweethearts for the rest of their lives.

Living in Pittsburgh, Canton, Carlisle, Shippensburg, Clearfield, Gardners, and Patton, being a pastor's wife, Peggy was always busy and moving. Peggy graduated from Loch Haven and taught first grade in several schools over 13 years. Her first school was in a housing project in Pittsburgh where her classroom was in a postwar 4-room quonset hut near the airport, and she loved it. She recalls one year that a duck made its home with the class.

Peggy remarked, “Never did Ray and I expect throughout 65 years of marriage that our final 2 years would be so limiting for us, but at the same time drawing us closer to God and also to one another. We were blessed with 2 children and 4 grandsons. Their assistance in our time of need and to this day continues to comfort and strengthen me, showing me love and joy as my adjustment to living away from my beloved neighbors and church friends. I admit this has been difficult.” Son Bob lives in Boiling Springs and daughter Betsy lives in New Jersey. Portraits of the 4 handsome and supportive grandsons smile down from Peggy's living area wall, along with photos of 2 great-granddaughters who live in Tennessee.

Peggy spends time in Country Meadows activities. There are Sunday worship services, sing-a-longs with a guitarist, professional musicians every Thursday, and all kinds of programs. A trip through the halls with Peggy finds everyone—residents and staff—greeting her. She knows so many people because she volunteers in the Trolley Gift Shoppe, a bright and well-stocked store at the entrance. “I feel this is a ministry to serve and help others in a small way.”

Recently, the area Life Song Hospice organizer mentioned to Peggy that the hospice needed more prayer shawls than Trolley Road volunteers were able to make to gift to local seriously ill veterans. Peggy thought of Bethlehem's Prayer Shawl Ministry and passed on the message. The result was a delivery in March of 13 additional lap robes, thanks to Sue Sharp and her group.

“My first year at Trolley Road has been much easier than I could ever have hoped for. The staff who is so supportive and pleasant cause me to be quite happy to get up each morning, giving me reason to smile and offer my daily prayer to God, asking for help to check my attitude and be thankful for the blessings of my life—as it has been and is now at my present stage.”

QCD Information Sheet

Support your Church ~ and ~ Reduce your Income Tax

Do a "QCD", a Qualified Charitable Distribution

Why consider this?

a QCD changes taxable income into **non-taxable** income

Who should do this?

you have a TRADITIONAL IRA account (or SEP or SIMPLE IRA) and you have attained age 70 ½

How does this reduce my tax?

Old way - you withdraw money from your Traditional IRA.

You pay tax on the withdrawal.

New way - you direct money to go directly from your IRA to your church.

You do **NOT** pay tax on the withdrawal.

The QCD effectively gives you a tax deduction for your contribution, even though you don't "itemize deductions" on your tax return

How much QCD can I do?

you can do any amount up to \$100,000, every year.

When can I start to do Church contributions by QCD?

You can do your first QCD in the year you attain age 70 ½

If I do a QCD, do I have to continue doing a QCD every year after that?

No - you can decide each year whether to do a QCD, and how much to do

I am now age 73 or older, and I am **required** to take distributions from my retirement account, these are called **RMD**, or Required Minimum Distributions.

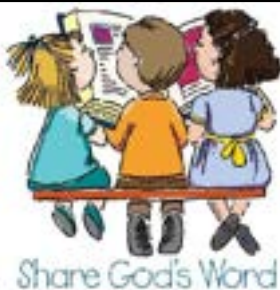

Psalm 23
Find: In this psalm, what are three ways God shepherds us?
Activity: Reflect on how God has been your shepherd in the past week.

Psalm 27
Find: What does David say about his source of strength and confidence?
Activity: Memorize Psalm 27:1 and recite it when you feel afraid today.

Psalm 34
Find: Who does the Lord hear?
Activity: Share with someone a testimony of how God has been good to you.

Psalm 37
Find: According to this psalm, what 4 things can you do instead of worrying?
Activity: Choose one action from Psalm 37 to focus on today.

Psalm 42
Find: What imagery does the psalmist use to describe his longing for God?
Activity: Write down one way you can draw closer to God when you feel distant.

Find: In David's prayer of repentance, what are three things he asks of God?
Activity: Write your own prayer of repentance to God.

Find: In this psalm, what does David say he will do?
Activity: Sing or listen to your favorite hymn or worship song.

Psalm 65
Find: How does this psalm describe God's abundant provision?
Activity: Write down three things you're thankful that God has provided.

Psalm 73
Find: What does the psalmist realize after feeling envious of the wicked?
Activity: Reflect on a time you needed God's strength and how he provided it.

Psalm 84
Find: What does the psalmist say about people who dwell in God's house?
Activity: Write down one way you can cultivate a heart of worship today.

Psalm 121
Find: What does this psalm promise about God's care for you?
Activity: Reflect on how God has "kept" you in difficult times. Then share that with someone.

Psalm 111
Find: What does the psalmist say is the beginning of wisdom?
Activity: Think of times in the Bible when God saved his people.

Psalm 101
Find: What actions and attitudes can we follow from this psalm?
Activity: Take time today to bless the Lord by recalling his goodness in your life.

Psalm 100
Find: What instructions does this psalm give for worshipping God?
Activity: Create a gratitude list. Then thank God for each item.

Psalm 91
Find: According to this psalm, what are some ways God protects his people?
Activity: Pray for God's protection over yourself or someone you know.

Psalm 136
Find: What does this psalm promise about God's care for you?
Activity: Reflect on one specific way God has shown you his enduring love.

Psalm 139
Find: What does this psalm say about God's knowledge of you?
Activity: Pray, thanking God for knowing you and your life intimately.

Psalm 146
Find: Based on this psalm, who are some people God takes care of?
Activity: Start your day with a song of praise to God.
