

Whether you've been part of Bethlehem Church for decades or you're new and looking for connection, Life Groups are a place for you. Our hope is that over these 8 weeks, you'll not only grow in knowledge of God's Word but also experience the joy of being knit together in Christian fellowship.

This fall don't walk the journey of faith alone. Step into community. Experience the blessing of living life together. Let's see how God will work in and through us as we gather, grow, and go out to be the hands and feet of Jesus in Dallastown and beyond.





#### ALL SAINTS' SUNDAY SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 2, 2025

## **Finance Updates**

To Bethlehem Church congregation,

I wanted to share an important development in our Church's financial operation.

One of the last vestiges related to our former association with the United Methodist Church has been our use of the services provided by the UMC Foundation of Pennsylvania. For those individuals unfamiliar with this entity, they are an investment group that was used by the denomination to primarily handle the monies representing Bethlehem's Endowment funds as well as similar funds for other UMC congregations. Responding to concerns shared by a few Church members regarding our continued association with this entity post disaffiliation, I formed an ad hoc group of the Finance Committee at the end of last year to develop a plan to address this. Three individuals with market investment experience were identified and asked to serve. They, as presented here in no particular order are, Keith McGuigan, local CPA; David Lentz who has been active in the personal management of his own portfolio; and Ron Smith, former York County Commissioner who had previous involvement with funds investment activities for the County of York. These three individuals who are all members of Bethlehem, worked tirelessly over the intervening months to craft an investment protocol for Bethlehem. This would later provide details to a subsequently selected investment broker and company summarizing among other things, the nature of investments deemed appropriate for a non-profit organization such as a church.

The document they created is referred to as an Investment Policy Statement or (ISP). Included in this document in addition to investment appropriateness, would also contain expectations regarding acceptable returns guidelines, safety/security of principal, as well as fees and related costs.

The second charge for this group was the selection of an investment firm and its representative. Three different local individuals and their respective organizations were interviewed and the one that came the closest to their ideal candidate was the firm Edward Jones and representative.

We are in the closing stages of completing paperwork, to make this process legal and official. Once that occurs, we will be liquidating and transferring our funds from the Fellowship Foundation to Edward Jones. The other action that Edward Jones will handle is the establishment of a brokerage account for Bethlehem. As you may recall, the bequest the Church will be receiving from the Waltemeyer estate will be in the form of Coca-Cola stock. When the bank processes the final estate distribution and issues these shares, we must have an available brokerage account in place to receive them.

Since I've referenced the bequest, I can share that we continue to wait patiently for these stock shares to arrive. The delay is the result of a mandatory IRS audit, necessary for an estate of this size. Truist Bank which is handling the estate, has indicated that they feel it is very unlikely that settlement will occur anytime in 2025 and in fact could very well take until close to the end of 2026 for that to occur.

In closing, I'd like to express my appreciation to our three-member Investment reps for the fine job they performed, pulling this program together. Their work won't end here however. Ongoing, they will continue meeting periodically to review and monitor the performance of our investments and these activities will also include periodic discussions with our reps from Edward Jones.


